DO YOU HAVE A LEAN MUSIC BUDGET? by Will Sherwood

Most of us are often plagued by music budget limitations - it seems to be a fact of church life. Here are some suggestions for finding needed funds.

There are often parishioners who might be willing to donate a small amount for a specific purpose. Our job is to identify those people and match them up with an enticing need. Don't be shy to ask. Some people will help out knowing they will have an impact on the music program. Often the more direct information that we can supply, the more willing people are to help. Possible sources -

- Publicize specific needs in the parish bulletin
- Ask the treasurer, bookkeeper/minister whom you should approach
- Suggest designation of memorial gifts to the music fund
- Ask a parishioner who is a community music supporter
- Ask one who appreciates the music program and its future development
- Ask business people who might be intrigued with the idea of supporting the program
- Suggest a specific contribution in memory of a loved one
- Ask a parent of a child in the choir to purchase a new anthem for Palm Sunday, Easter, Christmas or other special occasion

Possible needs -

what the needs are.

- Engaging instrumentalists for accompanying special or seasonal music
- Supporting young artists to play a prelude and postlude
- Buying a set of new music for the choir (or children's choir)
- Contributing toward the maintenance of the instruments, requesting specific needs
- Contributing toward the purchase of a new rank of organ pipes (or even a single pipe)
- Contributing toward a set of bells or the purchase of a single bell
- Purchasing a new chair for the choir rehearsal
- Contributing new or used office equipment

These are but a few suggestions that might help toward the expenses of running a quality music program. Many times there are people who just need to be asked and it is up to us to let them know



THE TRAGEDY THAT BROUGHT A COMMUNITY TOGETHER by Joan Venincasa

We are all saddened by the December 3 fire that claimed the lives of six Worcester fire fighters. 

HUMOURESQUE

The following program notes are from an unidentified piano recital, accompanying the biographical notes on the performers.

Tonight's page turner, Ruth Spelke, studied under Ivan Schmertnick at the Boris Nitsky School of Page Turning in Philadelphia. She has been turning pages here and abroad for many years for some of the world's leading pianists.

In 1988 Ms. Spelke won the Wilson Page Turning Scholarship which sent her to Israel to study page turning from left to right. She is a winner of the 1984 Rimsky Korsakov 'Flight of the Bumblebee' Prestissimo Medal, having turned 47 pages in an unprecedented 12 seconds. She was also a 1983 Silver Medallist at the Klutz Musical Page Pickup Competition: contestants retrieve and rearrange a musical score dropped from a Yamaha. Ms. Spelke excelled in 'grace, swiftness, and especially poise'.

For techniques, Ms. Spelke performs both the finger-licking and the bent-page corner methods. She works from a standard left bench position, and is the originator of the dipped-elbow page snatch, a style used to avoid obscuring the pianist's view of the music. She is Page Turner in Residence in Fairfield, Iowa, where she occuj tute. occupied the coveted Alfred Hitchcock Chair at the Fairfield Page Turning Insti-

Ms. Spelke is married, and has a nice house on a lake.



Worcester Chapter AGO The Restricted Funds Advisory Committee (RFAC)

from APRIL 2000 newsletter

Purpose:

To provide for the sound financial management of 1999 Convention proceeds and other restricted chapter funds and to promote the most beneficial expenditure of the income from these funds in the future.

Organization:

- 1. The Committee will consist of five members in good standing of the Worcester Chapter of the AGO. To create continuity, terms of service will be staggered with one position available each year.
- 2. The initial five members shall be appointed at the next meeting of the Executive Committee following the adoption of these rules and procedures. Of the first five members: one will be appointed for one year, one for two years, one for three years, one for four years and one for five years. Thereafter one new member will be appointed for a five-year term at the first executive committee meeting after the annual election to fill the expiring term. Unexpired terms will be filled by the Executive Committee at the next meeting after they become open.
- 3. No member shall serve for more than two consecutive terms.
- 4. The committee shall select its own chair and that person shall be a non-voting ex-officio member of the Executive Board.
- 5. The Dean and Treasurer of the Chapter will be non-voting ex-officio members of the Committee and all financial records will be kept by the Chapter Treasurer.

Meetings and Reports:

The Committee shall meet at least twice a year and shall submit minutes of all meetings to the Executive Committee. A detailed written financial report relating to all funds entrusted to it shall be submitted to the Executive Board upon request and to the membership at the annual meeting.

Tasks of the Committee:

- 1. To prudently invest all proceeds entrusted to them. In so doing they are authorized to seek investment, accounting and legal counsel as required and those services would be paid for with income from this fund.
- 2. To publicize the availability of grant money, to receive and review proposals requesting any distribution of moneys from this fund and give their recommendations for approval and distribution of funds to the Executive Board.
- 3. To determine each year an amount to be transferred to the Scholarship Fund for distribution based on a report of assessed need from the Scholarship Committee.

Funds Available for Distribution:

- 1. Only the income from this fund shall be available for distribution unless 2/3 of the chapter's voting membership vote to spend any portion of the principal. The committee is not required to recommend that all the income in any year be distributed.
- 2. Grant proposals may be submitted by any AGO member. Although not intended to be an exhaustive list, areas in which requests might be made include: educational projects, public outreach and awareness, research, commissioning of music, public concerts, chapter development, library needs, publications, recordings, and conventions. To be considered, a proposal must be consistent with the purposes of the American Guild of Organists and with the restrictions on charitable and educational tax exempt organizations. Traditional scholarship requests should not be submitted to this committee but to the Scholarship Committee which, after review, may then make a collective request for funds from this committee.
- 3. Grant proposals should be requesting funds for activities which augment the regular activities of the chapter. Requests, other than the requests of the scholarship committee, should be evaluated based on how they best serve the largest number of chapter members as possible. Specific guidelines as well as submission dates for proposals shall be set and published by the committee.

Conflict of Interest:

Members of this committee may submit requests for funds. However, no member of this committee may vote or be present during the discussion or vote of any proposal which directly or indirectly benefits her or him.

These guidelines for the Restricted Funds Advisory Committee voted and approved by the Executive Committee of the Worcester Chapter of the American Guild of Organists on Monday, February 28, 2000.


